JUBILEE 2025 PILGRIMS OF HOPE: A Jubilee Year is traditionally proclaimed by the Universal Church every 25 years. It is a particular year set aside to encourage the faithful to embark on pilgrimages, to repent of their sins and forgive the sins of others, and to renew a focus on the spiritual life. In the Hebrew tradition, as recorded in Leviticus, a Jubilee was celebrated every 50 years with the freeing of slaves and the forgiveness of debts. In 1300, Pope Boniface VIII instituted the first Christian Jubilee, and since then the Church has designated each new Jubilee as a special year of grace and forgiveness, offering the faithful an opportunity to obtain a plenary indulgence.

His Excellency Bishop Daniel Miehm has issued a **Jubilee Year Indulgence Decree** for the Diocese of Peterborough [READ DECREE]. The Decree states that four churches throughout the diocese may be visited by the faithful to fulfill the requirements for the indulgence: **St. Michael the Archangel** in Cobourg; **Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary** in Lindsay; **St. Patrick's** in Kearney; and principle among them, the **Cathedral of St. Peter-in-Chains** in Peterborough. May this Holy Year be a source of hope, rich in spiritual fruit for all the situations that are dear to us, especially for local and global situations in which hope seems to succumb in the face of so much evil and suffering in the world.

^{*} December 2024 Operating Expenses include the Annual Boiler Inspection of \$475, December snowplow bill of \$3,202 and other year-end annual charges from the Diocese, for example: Immaculate's share of Bank Charges, IT Support, Hospital Chaplaincy Wages, etc.

GOOD NEWS: You can see that our December Offertory hit the \$14,000 mark that is our average monthly expense! If parishioners continue to meet Father's plea for an extra \$10 per week, let's see if we can meet our expenses going forward. Also, you can add \$3,641.06 which is 75% of the Christmas Collection (25% goes to Diocese) to total December contributions of \$18,470. Our Operating Account is no longer at zero but is still very low.

BAD NEWS: However, December expenses are inflated (see above explanation), which still left us with a \$2,900 shortfall. And there will be over \$10,000 additional expenses coming soon: a \$4,200 payment for our recent roof repairs; and a \$6,000 insurance payment. Also, our church vacuum just died!
