Pope Francis will formally open the Jubilee at a Mass on Christmas Eve at St. Peter's Basilica. On Sunday, **December 29th**, bishops around the world will celebrate the start of the Jubilee Year in their Cathedrals.

His Excellency Bishop Daniel Miehm will celebrate this great liturgy at the 10:30 a.m. Mass that day. The faithful will be asked to gather outside the Knights of Columbus Hall (parking lot area) facing the veranda to hear the introductory remarks for the Jubilee Year. We will all "pilgrimage" across the street to St. Peter's cathedral for the continuation of the celebration of Holy Mass. Plenary Indulgences are available for the pilgrimage.
